Approximately \$13.4 million in awards will be funded by this program representing two years of appropriations. Applicants submitting the most competitive proposals will be invited to participate in the next level of the competitive process, anticipated Summer 2021. - Webinar: What CAISO didn't tell you about the August blackouts - Thursday, January 28th, 2021, 10:00AM. The California Independent System Operator (CAISO) called rolling blackouts throughout California on 14 and 15 August and threatened blackouts over Labor Day weekend, alleging a lack of sufficient electricity to serve Californians during those heat waves. CAISO's Final Root Cause Analysis, published on 13 January 2021, continues to sidestep the key questions. Speakers will discuss the deficiencies in CAISO's root cause analysis, troubling anomalies in the California market, and why California is still at risk of supply shortages and price increases caused by problems in the CAISO electricity markets.
