- B. Dave Revell, Coastal geomorphologist at Revell Coastal and Integral Consulting
 - Projects and policy development with coastal resiliency
 - Transition of funding from vulnerability assessments to facility level management/vulnerability (core components of facilities to reduce risks overtime)
 - A lot of the models (e.g. cosmos, pacific institute, noaa slr viewer) are not at the site specific level that are needed to evaluate those individual facilities
 - Public trust and State Lands Commission report coming out in October
 - San Mateo case study--how does a jurisdiction go from high level adaptation reports to day-to-day decisions
